

Parish priest the Reverend Canon Faiz Jerjes is widely known for his work for those in need. On 1 March UK Foreign Office Minister Lord Ahmad conferred upon him the British honour of an MBE, citing Fr Faiz's long and tireless service—not least in support of Yezidi women and girls who have suffered greatly at the hands of the terrorist group Da'esh.

As you see from this Spring edition of Quarterly Insight, Julia and I made a flying visit to Baghdad to coincide with Canon Faiz Jerjes's MBE award ceremony.

Both Lord Ahmad and the British ambassador were emphatic in stressing the remarkable contribution that Fr Faiz and St George's make not only to the Christian communities of Iraq but to the whole nation in its great religious and cultural variety. The presence of the representative of the Grand Ayatollah Husein al Sadr alongside a prominent tribal leader, the Papal Nuncio, and others was testimony to the breadth of St George's outreach.

Meanwhile the daily work of the church kindergarten and school go from strength to strength.

All this is in spite of the virtually stalled state of the country's politics and economy, which has been provoking frequent large-scale demonstrations for improvement and change that regularly disrupt access to our compound, situated as it is near a main entrance to the high-security government area called the Green Zone.
