Open Doors: Betsy Kolkea



Algeria is number 19 on Open Doors World Watch List.

A very small minority of the population are Christians, just 0.3%. Conversion from Islam is forbidden, and is punishable with beatings, forced evictions, insults, threats, forced marriages, harassment in the workplace, and economic sanctions. During 2023 and 2024 all churches were forcibly closed or services stopped, leaving Protestant Christians isolated. This has a disproportionate affect on women who are less able to find other forms of teaching and discipleship due to travel restrictions.

Let's commit **to keep praying** for our brothers and sisters in Algeria, and for the Open Doors partners in North Africa who provide discipleship training, livelihood support, legal aid, trauma counselling and Bibles.
