Open Doors: Betsy Kolkea



Last month we prayed for North Korean Christians. Recently a secret Open Doors fieldworker died. It is therefore now safe to tell his story. Cho said "My purpose in life is to save souls" and every week he hiked through the mountain forests to find North Koreans who had risked everything to flee their country. He provided food and drink and slowly built up trust. He offered them a Bible, and was often told "I don't believe in God. We're grateful for the food but we don't want anything to do with superstition."

Cho continued, saying "I give a Bible to every North Korean I meet. Sometimes they read it. Sometimes they refuse. My job is to tell people about Jesus. It's up to God to touch their hearts and anything is possible with God."

And Cho saw God move. "I've been reading the book you gave us. Then I had a dream. There was a person in my dream. He called me by name. I think it was the 'Jesus' this book talks about, and I want to find out more about Him."

Let's **never stop praying** for those, like Cho, who secretly continue in this work, risking their lives to share Jesus with courageous North Korean refugees.
